Principles

Children and youth work is subsidised by the City of Vienna and is based on the following principles:

- Orientation towards the realities of young people
- Observation and analysis of social space
- Focus on abilities, strengths, and needs of young people
- Low-threshold access
- No compulsion to buy
- Politically and denominationally neutral
- Cooperation between youth work and schools
- Respect for democratic principles, especially children's rights
- Voluntary participation
- Confidentiality and transparency towards children and youths
- Reflexive partiality
- Participation and strengthening of young people's self-management
- Promotion of health competence
- Diversity - with a focus on the diversity of different life situations
- Gender sensitivity - supporting equity of opportunities for all genders
- Networking and lobbying
- Awareness raising for sustainability and climate protection



Association-related children and youth work is not included in this folder. It has a religious, political, or ecological focus and usually requires children and youths to set up a membership. Working in association-related children and youth work is usually voluntary.
